### **Rector's Ramblings** ... The Busy Month of June (but I'm not complaining)

It used to be that the month of June was a time to be busy with weddings and graduations. Well, nowadays graduations seem to be over by the end of the first week, and most weddings are scheduled in April and May. So, I guess I can look forward to a relatively quiet month.

Well, not so much.

Sunday, June 4<sup>th</sup>, will be a big day as the Church celebrates the Day of Pentecost – the coming of the Holy Spirit. We will have a special observance at St. James' recognizing students, graduates, and those who will confirmed later in the afternoon (see info on pages 2-5).

Also in June I've been summoned to jury duty, and while I am usually ready to perform my civic responsibilities, the timing is problematic if chosen to serve more than a day or two. An unexpected, but welcomed trip to Jerusalem has come up relating to my service on the board of directors of the North American Committee (NAC) for St. George's College in Jerusalem. The president of the NAC is unable to attend the biannual meeting with the Archbishop in Jerusalem, and as the secretary of the board I've been asked to go in the place of the president. It is quite the honor, and more than a little unsettling, to be charged with representing the concerns of the NAC to the Archbishop and the heads of the Regional Committees of Britain, and Australia/New Zealand. I will only be in Jerusalem for three days, arriving on June 6<sup>th</sup> and catching a midnight flight home on June 8<sup>th</sup>. It's a good thing that I can usually get some sleep on airplanes.

The month of June will also require that I spend some time with issues surrounding the election of the next Bishop of Delaware. On June 3<sup>rd</sup> I will not only be attending an orientation in Middletown for delegates to the special convention that will be voting for our next bishop, but as the Diocesan Liturgical Officer I will begin planning the worship activities that will be held during the convention. Then, at the end of the month, the five candidates for bishop will be in Delaware for a tour of the State as well has hold three public meetings, one in each of the Delaware counties. During the meetings the candidates will be answering questions that have been submitted by members of the Diocese, and my plan is to attend all three of the public meetings to try and gain as clear an opinion as I can about each of the candidates.

So, all in all, I look forward to an exciting month – one filled with new experiences and calls to look at the concerns of the broader church. Not such a bad way to begin the summer.

## Candidates for XI Bishop of Delaware



**The Rt. Rev. Laura J. Ahrens** presently serves as the Bishop Suffragan in the Episcopal Church in Connecticut. Laura's passion for the Jesus Movement is seen in her commitment to exploring creative, innovative, and life-giving ways to share God's reconciling love. Offering vision, energy, and faithful leadership, she works closely with the congregations, diocesan camp, Episcopal schools, deacons, and a variety of chaplaincies in Connecticut.

Participating in the Jesus Movement involves deepening our understanding of God's love for us as well as seeking to share that love in the world. Laura encourages participation by teaching about being a disciple (follower) of Jesus and an apostle (one sent) to share the Good News. She invites individuals and worshiping communities to deepen their discipleship by seeking to be formed and informed by the teachings of Jesus in worship, prayer, and development of Christian community. Laura shepherds communities as they try on new and collaborative ways of being apostles.

Laura holds degrees from Princeton, Yale, and Hartford Seminary. Her spiritual practices include daily prayer, retreats with the Society of St. John the Evangelist, and regular meetings with a spiritual director.



**The Very Rev. Michael Battle** was ordained by Archbishop Desmond Tutu in 1993, and has served as vicar, chaplain, priest-in-charge, rector, provost/dean of a cathedral center, and missionary. On two occasions, he moved churches located in ethnically changing neighborhoods (Asian in one and Hispanic in the other) to adapt and grow with these changing demographics. Currently appointed as the Herbert Thompson Professor of Church and Society and the Director of the Desmond Tutu Center at The General Theological Seminary in New York, Battle's education includes a B.A. from Duke University, an M.Div. from Princeton Theological Seminary, an S.T.M.

from Yale University and a Ph.D. in theology and ethics from Duke University. In 2010, Battle was awarded one of the highest Anglican Church distinctions as one of Canterbury Cathedral's Six Preachers by the Archbishop of Canterbury, Rowan Williams — a distinction given to only a few who demonstrate great dedication to the church that goes back to 16<sup>th</sup> century England and Thomas Cranmer. As theologian, Battle served as canon theologian, vice president, academic dean, interim dean, and professor. Battle has published ten books, including the book for the Episcopal Church's General Convention, *Ubuntu: I in You and You in Me*.



**The Rev. Kevin S. Brown** is a creative and energetic parish priest who knows first-hand that the love of Jesus Christ transforms lives. He is a trusted leader, skilled teacher and preacher, and compassionate pastor with a background in finance and administration and a knack for collaboration and innovative ministry.

Kevin's reputation for sparking new ministries is highlighted by two examples from his current parish, Church of the Holy Comforter in Charlotte. "Common Morning, Common Prayer" offers lay-led Morning Prayer daily throughout Lent in coffee shops

and workplaces across the city. The groups are open and inviting, and opportunities to reach folks outside the church, which have been powerful. Also, Kevin led the merger of separate English and Spanish preschools into a single groundbreaking school focused on bilingual education and dedicated to access for low-income and immigrant families. La Escuelita not only educates, but it also actively unites children and parents across linguistic and socioeconomic divides. Kevin's creative leadership spans congregations both large and small, and it reaches beyond the parish to convocational, diocesan, and national church levels. He recognizes the importance of community involvement, marked by his long commitment to ecumenical and interfaith groups and service on school and non-profit boards.

Kevin grew up in Asheville, North Carolina and studied at Duke University. He completed his M.B.A. while in the Air Force, worked in finance and marketing at FedEx, and launched an investment firm before his call to priesthood. His wife Caroline is an accomplished artist. They have two daughters, both in college in N. Carolina.



**The Rev. Patricia S. Downing** is the rector of Trinity Episcopal Church in Wilmington, a diverse, vibrant community of faith that worships in two languages and in two locations. While she has served there, Trinity/Old Swedes Parish has continued to energetically engage the Gospel in its urban setting and undergone a \$2.5 million renovation, and Old Swedes Parish has become part of the First State National Historic Park. Before coming to Trinity in 2008, she was the rector of Good Shepherd Church in Silver Spring, Maryland for 12 years.

In addition to her ministry at Trinity, Patty has served as president of the Standing Committee, vice-chair of the Diocesan Council, and a member of the Finance Committee as well as other roles in the diocese. In the city, Patty serves on the boards of the American Civil Liberties Union (ACLU) and the Coalition to Dismantle the New Jim Crow. In the wider church, she is a deputy to General Convention; a member of the Program, Budget and Finance Committee; and a trustee of The General Theological Seminary.

Patty received her B.A. from the University of Vermont and her M.Div. from The General Theological Seminary in New York. Patty has been married to Dickie since 1995. Patty enjoys golf, horseback riding, traveling, and good food.



**The Rev. Canon Scott A. Gunn** has enjoyed a fruitful ministry leading Forward Movement as its executive director for the past six years. As you may know, Forward Movement produces *Forward Day by Day*, digital offerings, and online resources. Serving in a church-wide ministry, he has preached and taught across the church, and he's witnessed congregations and dioceses of all kinds and sizes thriving with effective leadership focused on following Jesus. Before his call to Forward Movement, Scott was a parish priest in the Diocese of Rhode Island, where he was curate in one congregation and rector of another. In

both congregations, he saw growth and transformation when scriptures were opened, liturgies were transcendent, joy was nurtured, and mission sent people out. Prior to ordination, Scott worked in technology for a nonprofit, a media company, and a university. He was educated at Luther College, Yale Divinity School, and Brown University. Scott's leadership and ministry are driven by broad vision, along with a passion for discipleship and evangelism. He looks forward to getting to know you better in the coming weeks, and he hopes that the Holy Spirit will guide the diocese toward becoming the Delaware branch of the Jesus Movement.

Scott is married to Sherilyn Pearce, also a priest who serves at Christ Church Cathedral in Cincinnati, where they live. They both enjoy traveling and dog walks. Scott loves photography, writing, and seriously good coffee.
