November 23rd at 7:00pm - Thanksgiving Eve Ecumenical Service of the Mill Creek Ministerium

On Wednesday, November 23rd at 7:00pm, the churches of the Mill Creek Ministerium will gather for their annual Thanksgiving Eve Service, this year to be held at the new St. Philip's Lutheran Church, 5320 Limestone Rd, Wilmington, DE 19808. Participating churches are Marshallton United Methodist, Limestone Presbyterian, St. John the Beloved Roman Catholic, St. James' Episcopal Mill Creek, St. Philip's Lutheran, St. Mark's United Methodist, and St. Barnabas' Episcopal. Following the tradition of this service, the choir members of all of the churches have been invited to sing an anthem in a combined choir.

To Advent 2016

The Start of a New Church Year – The First Sunday of Advent, which this year falls on November 27th, marks the beginning of a new Church Year. Advent, from the Latin word *adventus*, means 'coming' or 'emergence' and is the season during which Christians prepare for the coming of Christ, most notably observed with the celebration of the birth of Jesus. Since Jesus has already been born, however, it also carries the call to prepare for when the Risen Christ will come again in power and great glory.

November 27th – Make an Advent Wreath for Your Home – Continuing a Saint James' Church tradition, we will be making Advent Wreathes in the Great Hall of the Parish House on the First Sunday of Advent. Straw forms, fresh greens, floral pins and candles will be available (donations kindly accepted), but feel free to bring some of your own materials. The activity takes place between 9-10am. This year Fr. Jim is asking that all of the Advent Wreathes be brought to the 10:15am service so they might be blessed in the Church. To Christmas 2016
