Please be aware that as a result of some recent incidents, the decision has been made to keep **the door of the Parish House locked at all times during the week**. Formerly it had been left open in the mornings during the arrival time of pre-school parents dropping off their children and on other occasions such as Tuesday mornings when the Bazaar Group arrives.

Going forward, please ring the bell for admittance. If you have a key and can let yourself in, please be sure to lock the door behind you as you enter, otherwise you leave the door open to others.

Also, recently the door has been found open in the mornings. Please note that sometimes the door does not close properly without being specifically pulled shut. <u>Please double check</u> that the door is locked and fully closed after you enter or leave the building. Thank you!

Nominees for Vestry

Five elected positions on the Vestry will need to be filled at the Annual Meeting. Here are the current nominees (nominations will also be taken from the floor on the day of the meeting):

Ed Clark has been a member of St. James' for 52+ years. He has been on the Vestry three or more times and senior warden twice. He was senior warden during a time when we had no priest but used three different priests as supply clergy. He was in the choir for 35+ years and has recently rejoined the choir.

Eileen Marvel is a "cradle" Episcopalian, who has been a member of St. James' since moving to Delaware in 1987. She has supported the parish through many ministries over the years, among them teaching pre-k Sunday school, being a member of the Parish Life and Mission/Outreach committees, serving on the vestry, and being Clerk of the Vestry for a year. In addition, she is currently Laundry Coordinator for Family Promise and sings in the St. James' Choir. She lives in Limestone Gardens with her husband, Doug, and their two cats, Abbey and Bob.

Ian Prescott moved to Delaware right before the year 2000 and his family joined St. James soon after. He grew up in the church, was involved in Sunday school and the Christmas Pageant, and was confirmed at St. James'. In fourth grade, he began to acolyte and did so until he completed 12th grade. He took pride in serving as an acolyte; it was a great experience to be a part of the liturgical team at St. James' for so long. He has worked at the turkey dinner, church cleanups, Family Promise, and other church missions over the years. He really found his faith during his college years; it is something that gives him strength, hope, and calmness. It is definitely a guiding force in his life and you can find him on Sundays seated upstairs across from the choir. He has two parents that have vestry experience and would love to earn the privilege to become the third Prescott to serve. He feels, as a millennial, he can bring a unique perspective and voice to the vestry. 2019 is a tough time for churches as a whole. He feels he can become an asset that positively impacts the church and it would be an honor to give back and serve this great community.

Bruce Vrana has been a member of St. James' for over 30 years, along with his wife Jenny and children Robert and Laura. He has served as an usher and on various committees, and has been elected to the Vestry for 6 two-year terms previously, including eight years as Sr. Warden. He served the Diocese on the Standing Committee for four years, including during the recent Bishop Search. He was recently elected to a six-year term on the Trustees of the Diocese. He is a chemical engineer at DuPont and teaches the senior design course at Penn, his alma mater.

Susan Winward has been a member of St James since the age of 12 when she was finally able to convince her parents to leave the Episcopal church they attended in the City of Wilmington to be able to walk to the neighborhood church and she could join the youth group! During her many years at St James' she has served in multiple capacities including former Senior Warden, Sunday School

Superintendent, Sunday School Teacher, Family Promise Coordinator, and currently she serves as Receiving Treasurer, a member of the Flower Guild, the FAC committee, Usher, and Turkey Dinner volunteer. She has been married to her husband, David, for 30 years and they have a son, Alexander, and she is step-parent to Andrea and David, Jr. They enjoy traveling and spending time at their second home in Lewes. She has been employed for more than 25 years as CEO of a small credit union. She is honored to be considered for a position on the Vestry and welcomes the opportunity to serve.
