#### • How Do We Move Forward?

During the Team's discussions, we realized the Vestry no longer had an official/formalized connection with the various Ministries/Committees. We feel this connection is essential to helping strengthen, reestablish, reenergize, and sustain our church and its ministries. And, at the March Vestry meeting, the Journey Team made the following recommendation to the Vestry:

Based on the feedback from the congregation and our work to date, the Journey Team recommended reestablishing a more formal connection between the Vestry and ministries/committees of St. James by the following:

- 1. Identify which ministries/committees support the mission and dream for St. James
- 2. Determine which ministry/committees are active, need to be reactivated, need to be established or eliminated
- **3.** Identify Vestry Shepherds to help support, strengthen and sustain our ministries/committees
- 4. Review and confirm a viable ongoing structure for each ministry/committee

#### To support this initiative and strengthen communication, the Journey Team will continue working with and supporting the Vestry Shepherds and ministry leaders. At the annual meeting, we will share HOW YOU can be a part of this important process.

Please note, while the financial health of St. James was a reoccurring concern expressed in your feedback and we acknowledge our obligation to be responsible stewards of God's gifts, our parish by-laws direct that responsibility to the Vestry. The Financial Advisory Committee (FAC) will continue to support the Vestry regarding financial matters. And, the Journey Team has and will continue to offer help, support, thoughts, and suggestions to the Vestry but will not actively participate in the management of our financial resources.

We are excited to join together for worship, fellowship, and discussion at the Annual Meeting on April 17<sup>th</sup>. We will celebrate our legacy and share how we can continue working together to support and strengthen the many ministries and mission of St. James.
