Changes Ahead for Christmas 2016

The Worship Life Minsitry Team wants to get the word out concerning the schedule of Christmas Services, as a few things will be different this year.

For Christmas Eve, Saturday Dec 24th, two services (rather than three) will be offered in consideration of our available resources and overall attendence in recent years.

Additionally, both Christmas Day, Dec 25th, and New Year's Day, Jan 1st, fall on Sundays, so for both of those days there will be one service only at 9:00am.

So, the holiday schedule will look like this:

- Saturday, Christmas Eve, Dec 24th, 2016
 - ~ 7:30pm, Youth-Led Service with Holy Eucharist
 - ~ **10:00pm**, Candlelight Service with Holy Eucharist
- Sunday, Christmas Day, Dec 25th, 2016
 - 9:00am, Quiet Holy Eucharist
- Sunday, New Year's Day, Jan 1st, 2017
 - ~ 9:00am, Christmas Lessons & Carols with Holy Eucharist

"Jesse's Gift" - Help a Needy Child

One of the traditions that Fr. Jim brought to St. James' is his Christmas Eve retelling of the true story of his encounter many years ago with a poor Native American man and his son Jesse. The father's care for his young son's schooling, and Jesse's gesture of thanks, are both loving and profound in their simplicity.

In past years, some people have brought school supplies to the Christmas Services to be given to poor children in honor of "Jesse's Gift". The Journey Team wanted to rekindle this spirit, and a member of the Team, Val Hall, contacted her principal at Shortlidge Elementary to inquire what was most needed by some of the students in this school that serves a very poor population. It turns out that it was not school supplies that these children needed, but rather socks, shoes, and pajamas!

Donating shoes might be difficult (although The Jounrey Team is looking into that further), but we can do the rest. Children at Shortlidge Elementary are ages 5-10 and most would wear pajamas sized 6-8, 8-10, and 10-12 and socks sized 7-8 1/2 or 9-11.

Before you come to worship this Advent or Christmas, please consider purchasing clothing items in the sizes indicated. Then bring them to Church to help a needy child in the area stay warm and be prepared to come to school knowing that someone out there cares for them.

DEC 4th at 9:00am – Stewardship Celebration Breakfast

The 2017 Pledge Campaign has gone well, with the total amount pledged up 4 percent over the current year. To celebrate all that we have to offer from what God has blessed us with, the Vestry and the Journey Team will host a free breakfast for everyone in the parish on Sunday, December 4th. Please plan to join them at 9:00am in the Parish House for a little pre-Christmas joy, feasting, and fellowship.


RSVP Now for Bishop's Farewell Reception on January 12th

The families consist of 8 children and 4 adult heads of the family. The first family: Mother is unemployed/looking for work. Father left family/not paying child support. The second family: Homeless; father is caregiver. He is disabled, and his child is also disabled. The third family: Young mother with baby son. Living with grandmother because child required hospitalization after birth, and mother then hospitalized with complications of a chronic illness. The fourth family is homeless; mother has three children.

Make this yummy treat to give to family and friends at Christmas,




What you need:

- Nonstick cooking spray
- 3 cups chocolate chips
- Microwave-safe bowl
- Spoon or spatula
- 2 Tbsp. shortening
- Baking tray lined with wax paper
- Red and green M&M's (or sprinkles)

What you do:

- 1. Lightly spray bowl and wax paper.
- 2. Microwave chocolate chips in bowl for one-minute intervals until chocolate is melted. (Stir after each minute.)
- 3. Stir in shortening. Heat in 10-second intervals, stirring until smooth.
- 4. Pour chocolate onto tray and firmly press in M&M's or sprinkles.
- Refrigerate until firm.
 Remove bark and break into pieces.
