A Word from Fr. Jim: "Beggar"

A blind beggar was sitting by the roadside. When he heard that it was Jesus of Nazareth, he began to shout out and say, "Jesus, Son of David, have mercy on me!" (Mark 10:46c-47)

What drives a person to become a beggar? It is easy to dismiss those who beg for donations at street corners as people without motivation to work, or worse, just running a scam. Putting those mental impulses aside, do we - can we - ever really know what life has wrought that would leave individuals with no other option than to depend on the meager gifts of pocket change that we might offer? The beggar that Jesus encountered was blind, which might explain his need to depend on others, but what he asked from Jesus was not coins. He asked to be shown mercy; to be seen as a person with value, solely on the basis of the humanity he shared with all the other children of God. We may not have to beg for money, but we are all beggars who need the mercy of God in order to be whole, and with that in mind perhaps we might look at others around us with more charity of understanding and generosity.

## Tercentennial Campaign funds needed to get Diocesan Match down to \$20,000

The last time we wrote you, we said we needed \$30,000 to get to the \$50,000 Diocesan match. We are now down to \$20,000 which includes pledges that are still outstanding. If you still have a pledge balance, please finish those payments by the middle of December so we can report to the Diocese that we have met our goal. Only monies in hand will count toward the \$300,000 goal. If you are not sure if you have a balance, we will be contacting those with outstanding balances very soon.

As most of you already know, the new tax laws may mean that you are no longer able to itemize deductions. However, retirees age 70-1/2 can take advantage of using IRA funds to transfer money to the charities they support using Qualified Charitable Distributions and having it count as part of their IRA Required Minimum Distribution. This can lower your taxable income even if you don't itemize. This strategy can be used for either the Capital Campaign or the Annual Fund at St. James' (or any other fund you may wish to support).
